This web site is devoted to creation of worksheets focusing on the three major holidays in December, namely Christmas, Hannukah and Kwanzaa.

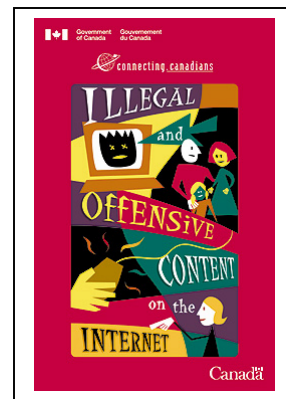
